#### There are now two entry dates for perishable and nonperishable goods

- Entry Forms: must be submitted with the exhibit.
- Entries must be delivered to the Showground Pavilion: <u>Nonperishables sections</u> B, F, G, H J, K, L, M, N & O will be Friday 14 February 4-6pm or Saturday 15 February 2025 between 8.30am- 12pm. <u>Perishables sections</u> A, C, D, E & I will be on Saturday 1 March 2025 between 8.30am - 12pm. The pavilion will close at 12pm for lunch and judging for the Sections will commence at 1pm.
- All exhibits must be collected from the Pavilion between 2pm 4pm on Show Day. If not collected at this time, entries will be discarded.
- Prize money will only be given for special awards and classes listed in the Schedule. Prize money must be collected on Show Day or will be forfeited except by prior arrangement.
- Cards awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Highly Commended. Pavilion open to the public from 9:00am Sunday 2 March 2025.

#### Conditions of Entry

- 1. Exhibitors shall, if required, provide proof as to bona fides of their exhibits and if proved to have knowingly made a false entry will forfeit prizes and be barred from exhibiting at the Tarago Show.
- $2.\ Limit of 2\ entries\ per\ exhibitor\ per\ class, unless\ stated\ otherwise\ in\ Section/Class$
- 3. Judges' decisions and disputes. All protests must be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary by 12pm Sunday 2 March 2025. The protest is to be accompanied by a \$50 deposit to be forfeited if the Committee decides the protest is frivolous. Committee decisions are final and there is no right of appeal.
- 4. The Society accepts no responsibility for the loss of or damage to any exhibit, goods or possessions and will not be responsible for any accident caused to any exhibit and will not be responsible for any loss of livestock.
- 5. All exhibitors, competitors and members of the public enter the Show sites at their own risk.
- 6. All exhibitors, competitors and members of the public agree that entry to the Show permits the use for Show publicity purposes and future Show events of any photographs taken on the day of the Show.
- 7. For clarification: Each number within a section is considered a class e.g., Potted Plants (is the Section) and then 1. One potted Fern any variety (is the Class).

#### CONDITION OF ENTRY

- Apples and pears to have stem (calyx) intact, and may be polished
- Tomatoes to have their stems intact
- Rhubarb stalks should be torn from the plant and leaves trimmed to approx. 5cm
- Silverbeet/Chard, etc to be shown in water
- Potatoes should be brushed not washed

- 1. Beans, 12 any variety
- 2. Pumpkin, 1– any variety
- 3. Capsicum, 3 any variety

- $\bullet\,$  All entries to be shown in 375g  $-\,500g\,screw-topped\,jars$ 
  - $\circ\,$  Except preserved fruit, butters, and sauces
- Sauces to be shown in 200 250ml bottles
- Butters to be shown in 180 220g jar
- Jars/bottles to have no hats and plain lids (not plastic) free of any advertising
- Inside of lids to be clean and free of mould
- All jars and bottles to be labelled with product name
- Fill to 1 cm from top of jar or bottle
- Jamsetta is not to be used
- Exhibits of jams or preserves must be the bona-fide work of the exhibitor

- All cakes are to be on 20cm round sturdy disposable plates or boards, except:
- $\circ\,$  Slices and fruit cakes which can be on differing size and/shape plate or board
- Items are **not** to be displayed in cling wrap but must be in clear containers or oven bags. Entrant label **must be adhered to the underneath of the plate** itself not the bag.
- No packet cakes unless specified
- Exhibit must be the bona-fide work of the exhibitor
- 1. Orange Cake iced top only no decoration
- 2. Chocolate Cake, iced top only no decoration
- 3. Banana Bread
- 4. Any other cake/slice/brownie
- 5. Gluten Free Cake not iced any variety
- 6. 3 Vanilla Slices
- 7. Date Loaf 14cm x 24cm not iced
- 8. 6 Plain Scones
- 9. 6 Scones any other variety
- 10. 6 Biscuits any variety 1 type per entry
- 11. Rhubarb & Apple Pie
- 12. Loaf of Homemade Bread white, grain, sourdough or wholemeal (oven baked)

### **Section D – Cut Flowers**

#### **CONDITION OF ENTRY**

- NND (Not Necessarily Distinct):
  - $\circ\,$  Can be all the same cultivar
  - All different cultivars
  - $\circ\,$  Or a combination of same and different cultivars.
- Four stages bud to bloom:
  - $\circ$  Bud to show colour
  - $\circ\,$  Halfway between bud and exhibition
  - Exhibition stage
  - $\circ\,$  Full bloom with stamens showing

1. Decorative – formal or informal, Bloom, 1 only

#### Roses

- 2. One Rose of any colour
- 3. One bi-coloured Rose

- Exhibits in Section F must not have been laundered
- Exhibits must not have been exhibited at any previous Tarago Show
- Exhibit must be the bona-fide work of the exhibitor with exception to commercial quilting/Framing

#### Wool Craft CONDITION OF ENTRY

- Please attach labels stating fibre content and ply
- 1. A garment hand knitted/crochet eg; jumpers, not babywear
- 2. An article hand knitted/crochet eg; Shawls, Wrap, not baby wear
- 3. Babywear hand knitted/crochet garment or article
- 4. Small Accessories hand knitted/crochet eg; gloves, mittens, beanies, scarf, coat hanger, bags not baby wear
- 5. 1 Skein homespun wool or alpaca 50 grams 8 ply or less, state fibre
- 6. Novelty Item or toy Hand knitted/crochet/sewn eg; Stuffed doll, animal, teddy bear, soft toy.

- Entry is strictly for amateur photographers. (Exhibitor cannot be selling or making a living from sale of photographs)
- For display all photos will be attached to walls and **must be mounted on either black or white** cardboard (not thick).
- All photographs must have been taken (captured on camera) by the exhibitor within the past 12 months
- Prints should not exceed 50 cm on their longest side
- For Judging, photos must not be mounted behind glass
- Any entry previously exhibited at Tarago Show is ineligible
- The exhibitor's name and entry class must be clearly printed on the back of the cardboard mount.

### Section J – Art

#### Champion Ribbon and \$15 prize voucher for Best Exhibit in Section donated by The Big Merino

#### **CONDITION OF ENTRY**

- All artworks must be well-presented and dry
- Drawings and paintings must be ready to hang
- Work previously exhibited at Tarago Show cannot be entered again
- Work must have been completed in the past 2 years
- All work must be the original bona-fide work of the exhibitor, not copied from someone else's work and not traced
- Children's name, age, section & school must be clearly marked on the back

#### Paintings

#### Grand Champion Fleece Ribbon and \$25 prize donated by Vicki and Roger McMahon

#### Highest Point Score Ribbon and \$50 prize donated by Vicki and Roger McMahon

#### CONDITION OF ENTRY

- All fleeces to be skirted as for the market or to the judge's satisfaction
- Cartons for Fleeces are advisable
- Each fleece is to be submitted in a separate carton, marked with the exhibitor's name
- High point score calculated as 1st = 2 points, 2nd = 1 point
- Only commercial breeders (excluding stud breeders) eligible for high point score

#### Ram Fleece \*Eligible for champion Ram's fleece and Grand Champion

- 1. Superfine Ram's Fleece below 18 microns
- 2. Fine Ram's Fleece 18–20 micron
- 3. Medium Ram's Fleece 20–21 micron
- 4. Merino Ram's Fleece 22–24 micron

#### Ewe or Wether Fleece \*Eligible for champion Ewe or Wether's fleece and Grand Champion

- 5. Superfine Ewe or Wether's Fleece below 18 microns
- 6. Fine Ewe or Wether's Fleece 18–20 micron
- 7. Medium Ewe or Wether's Fleece 20–21 micron
- 8. Merino Ewe or Wether's Fleece 22–24 micron

#### Other Fleece \*Eligible for Grand Champion Only

- 9. Merino Hogget Fleece 20 micron and finer
- 10. Merino Hogget Fleece 20 micron and stronger
- 11. Merino Fleece Highest Commercial Value
- 12. Crossbred Fleece any micron \*Not Eligible for Grand Champion
