

Company of the

Hound is a 15th century reenactment group based in Tarago NSW. The Company was formed as a southern associated branch of the long-standing Company of the Gryphon from Caboolture, QLD.

Focusing on equestrian pursuits including joust and skill at arms,



as well as armoured foot combat, medieval archery, and reenactment of day-to-day military life in Western Europe between 1450 and 1490.

Company of the Hound presents the Skill at Arms competition and Joust at this Year's Tarago Show.



Company of the Errant

Knight is a dedicated historical medieval reenactment group that brings to life the thrilling combat and chivalric spirit of the late 14th and early 15th centuries. It's members use authentic armour and wield periodaccurate weapons in their combat displays, immersing themselves in the camaraderie of knights and the artistry of medieval warfare.

Experience the rich heritage of the medieval era through training, tournaments, and engaging activities that celebrate the valor and honor of the late Middle Ages. Company of the Errant Knight will be hoisting the Arming the Knight Through History and Foot Combat Displays in the Village Arena.

Australian Horse Archery

Association is the governing body for

Horse Archery in Australia under the International Horse Archery Alliance. In addition to developing policy and strategy for the sports growth in Australia, it also runs affiliated branches throughout the country so members can meet and practice in a safe and supportive environment.



The Canberra Region Branch has its home grounds at the Tarago Showground and will be providing the Horse Archery Display at 10:00am. It will also be running the BBQ next to the Baa Baa Bar to raise funds for the Australian and New Zealand Teams for the World Horse Archery Championships in the USA in September 2025.



Medieval Archery

Society The Medieval Archery Society (MAS) is a group of likeminded people who primarily portray an English mercenary company in France circa 1365. The groups is based in Sydney but participates in events around the

state. While many members' main focus is archery, many members have skills in medieval cooking, leatherwork, spinning and textiles, blacksmithing, fletching and foot combat.

Come along and watch the power of the longbow and other weapons in the MAS demonstration and archery competition at 9:00am in the Medieval Village.

Fechtschule Sankt Peter is a school

of historical fencing based in Sydney focussing on German longsword and Polish sabre. As the Szlachta Sydnejski, they present displays of sabre fighting as it was done in the 17th Century by nobles of the great Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth. You can see their display at 3pm in the Village Arena.





Milites de Sainte-Croix are a

re-enactment group based near Bathurst NSW.

Focussing on the material culture, armoured foot combat, equestrian skills and the presentation of a small retinue of household knights, squires and pages on campaign, and at tournament in the late 12th-mid 13thC

You can seem as part of the Arming of Knight Through the Ages display in the Village Arena, or on the field taking part in the mounted Skill at Arms in 13thC armour on the main arena.

The Revolting Peasants is a Living History Group that focuses upon re-creating the lower classes of the medieval time period specifically covering 1100 to 1250AD with our core location covering the British Isle & European countries. We are a group interested in researching and learning all of the cool things that nobles wouldn't sully their hands with. Catch them in the Medieval Village all day.



Historic Dance Delights are a

Canberra-based historic dance group covering dances from 1400s to early 1900s. They hold monthly balls, perform displays and run a Historic Dance Festival in July. Visit historicdancedelights.org.au for more information






Riding With Sticks is a Tarago based riding school and equine entertainment business. Run by local family Rodney and Liberty Deaman and Jacquiline-Lee Dominick, it offers riding instruction in horse archery, skill at arms, classical dressage, general riding, confidence management and horse handling. Riding With Sticks brings you the Historical

Solids Joust at this year's event in collaboration with the Tarago Show Society.

Marisma Equine Entertainment is based in Snake Valley Victoria and can provide horses and riders for a variety of shows and performances for live audiences, movies and short film work, tv ads, weddings and photoshoots. The Joust



In modern jousting, there are three types of joust you will typically see. Balsa Jousting, which is the most common in Australia, involves a solid lance 'handle' that has had the last metre or so removed and replace with a frangible balsa tip. This is done for safety, though these lances still require huge amounts of force to break them, and they are fully capable of delivering big hits. This year the Company of the Hound is back again with yet another fantastic jousting display.

American Solids is the type you may have seen on shows like 'Full Metal Jousting' and involves a pine dowel instead of the balsa tipped lance. It is typically not practiced outside of the USA.

And the last type is Historical Solids jousting. This seeks to recreate the joust exactly as it would have been done in the 15th Century with full length thick pine lances and steel tips called 'coronels' designed to grab the shield or armour of the opponents. This type of jousting requires the highest quality reproduction

armour, incredibly well-trained horses, and specialised types of helms based on the type that was popular 500 years ago for this very reason!

Historical Solid Lance jousting has a long and storied history in Australia. The first historical solid tournament in modern times was hosted by Rod and Michelle Walker (of the Horse Lords) in 2011. Andrew McKinnon brought the style to the forefront of medieval events with the annual St Ives Tournament in Sydney between 2014 and 2019 attracting the best jousters from all over the world, and also hosting the World Jousting Championships in 2016 and 2019. Unfortunately, the impact of COVID-19 on large events was felt particularly for this style of joust, which is quite expensive to run and thus tends to be tied to the largest events.

So we hope you understand when we say this year we bringing you something truly special! Rodney Deaman has passionately pursued Historical Solids jousting since he started down his jousting path, and through his business "Riding With Sticks" is bringing you the first Historical Solid Lance Jousting Tournament in Australia since 2019 – proudly supported by the Tarago Show Society.

Meet the Jousters

Balsa Joust - Company of the Hound - 11am



Sir Andrew is a founding knight of the Company and an experienced jouster of more than decade. He has travelled the world with the sport and has been instrumental in the reintroduction of historical solids jousting as the founder of the St Ives Medieval Festival and the World Jousting Championships. He is also a member of the Order of the Star, a prestigious honour, which upholds the values of modern jousting and promotes dedication to the sport in Australia.

Navarre, his Percheron gelding, has been with Sir Andrew at many events including Blacktown Medieval Faire, Abbey Medieval Festival, St Ives Medieval Festival, The Tournament of the Golden Tree, and Keith Ryal Memorial Tournaments. Sir Andrew is the two-time winner of the Joust at Tarago Medieval Fair, and will no doubt bring it all to defend his title.

Lady Jay is a local rider and member of the Riding With Sticks team. She has pursued her love of all things medieval for the past 10 years and has ridden for most of her life. She and has been a dedicated squire to Sire Rodney for many years and

was recently made a Knight of the Hound by him following the completion of her training – the first outside the founding knights to achieve this rank. She has jousted at the Tarago Medieval Faire, Newbridge Winter Solstice Festival, and was deemed worthy by the Order of the Star at Victorian Medieval Fair.

She rides in her stunning 15th Century armour on her mount NS Elani, who she has trained personally and who makes her debut at this event. She will be aiming to give Sir Andrew a fierce challenge this year!





Squire Tamsen

This year our joust will be a little different, with two of the Company Squires aiming to participate in their first public joust.

Tamsen is a long-term member of the Company

and has been an aspiring jouster for many years. She is a lifelong and skilled rider, pursuing many more traditional equine sports over the years, and has participated in the Skill at Arms competitions at both the Tarago Medieval Faire and Blacktown Medieval Faire. She now squires formally for Sir Rodney and has been building her harness and training her mount Venom in preparation for her first joust.

Squire Sean

Sean is another long-term member of the Company and aspiring jouster. Sean has show tremendous dedication to his desire to joust, beginning with almost know riding experience but training hard to learn and improve his skills in a short timeframe. Sean squires for Sir Andrew and wears a 15th century continental field armour he has constructed.



Historical Solids Joust – 2:30 pm



Sir Rodney is Captain of the Company of the Hound and co-owner of Riding with Sticks. He has pursued jousting relentlessly for the past four years, competing in Tournaments across the country and winning the Orange Medieval Fair and Victorian Medieval Faire. Later this year Rodney will represent Australia in England. Rodney has dreamed of competing in Historical Solid Lance tournaments since the beginning and has decided

to make that dream a reality by brining it to the Tarago Medieval Faire.

Lady Renae is a world-renowned jouster and fierce competitor. Jousting since 2019 under the guidance of her husband Sir Clifford, she has proven to be among the worlds best. She is the first woman to ever win the Arundel International Jousting Tournament and is the current Australian Joust Champion. She was part of the Australian Team for the 'smashes tournament' in 2023 and 2025 and has jousted in the European Joust Championships, Norway and Canada. Lady Renae has also pursued historical solids for a number of years, performing the first passes in Australia since 2019 with Sir Rodney late last year.





Sir Clifford is the veteran of our historical solids tournament, having competed in and won historical solids tournaments around the world. He was the winner of the St Ives Solids Tournament in 2016 and 2019 and the solids Tournament of St Michel in France in 2018, as well as too many balsa joust tournaments to list here. Most recently he has won the Trollspeillet Tournament in Norway, took out the Joust at the European Joust Championships, and represented Australia at the Smashes Tournament and Arundel. He is a member of the Order of the Star, a founding Member of the Company of the Spur, a world-renowned horseman and a former pro bull rider to boot.



Previously known as the Cow Pat Lotto, the Unicorn Poop Lotto Competition is a new spin on an old favourite at the annual Tarago Show!

We've been lucky enough to find ourselves a wonderful, local Unicorn who was happy to help us out this year, and with his help, you might be lucky enough to


Further thanks is due to the huge number of reenactors and stall holders who made our Medieval Faire possible this year!
